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Launch of MADAMIKANA - the crossroads, an artistic journey through anicinabe territory

Parc national d'Aiguebelle celebrates its 40th anniversary with the inauguration of a permanent work of Anicinabe art by Frank Polson

Abitibi-Témiscamingue, May 12, 2025 — To mark the official opening of the Taschereau campground's summer season and their 40th anniversary, Parc national d'Aiguebelle and Minwashin invite the public to the unveiling of the first permanent work of the project MADAMIKANA - the crossroads, created by renowned Long Point First Nation Anicinabe artist, Frank Polson.

A public art project deeply rooted in the territory

MADAMIKANA, an Anicinabe word meaning "crossroads", evokes those symbolic places where history, territory, art and people meet. Supported by the Minwashin cultural organization, this artistic mediation project celebrates the millennia-old presence of the Anicinabek through the creation and installation of six public artworks in the four corners of the anicinabe aki - the Anicinabe territory.

Each work, inspired by Anicinabe archives and elders' stories, becomes a tangible trace of living memory, a mark of recognition of the territory, and an invitation for dialogue between peoples.

The opening will take place on Saturday, May 24, 2025 at 1 pm, at the Taschereau sector of Parc national d'Aiguebelle. The event will mark both the start of the MADAMIKANA artistic trail and the park's 40th anniversary, reinforcing the links between culture, territory and natural heritage.

Madamikana - the crossroads - evokes this symbolic space where history, territory, art and nations meet. This artistic mediation project, led by Minwashin, celebrates the age-old presence of the Anicinabek on their ancestral territory through art. Six permanent, vibrant works, nourished by the stories of the elders and the archives of the Anicinabe Nation, will mark the territory of Abitibi-Témiscamingue. Each work, like a star, is part of a living constellation and an invitation to explore the territory differently, to renew links between peoples.
